About SWP

Over the past 7 years, using human rights and harm reduction approaches, the Sex Workers Project (SWP) has protected and promoted the rights of individuals who engage in sex work, regardless of whether they do so by choice, circumstance, or coercion. In addition to providing direct legal services to over a hundred individual clients a year in immigration, criminal legal, civil, and police misconduct matters, we conduct dozens of "know your rights" trainings, and engage in critical outreach to service providers and community organizations who may come into contact with trafficked persons or sex workers. Our direct service and human rights documentation work enables us to provide unique and critical information, analysis, and practical recommendations for policy advocacy at the local, state, federal and international level aimed at securing systemic change grounded in the experiences and concerns of our constituencies.
